Due to some vendor scheduling issues, we were forced to delay the opening day of the Club to Wednesday, February 28. With that said, we were able to complete all mandated Health Department requirements during this shutdown. Here's what we accomplished:

- Updated Ventilation Hood and Fire Suppression System in the Kitchen to fully meet code.
- Installed a stand-alone hand sink in Bar area.
- Stand-alone mop sink in the kitchen area will be installed by March 6.
- Repaired and adjusted shelving in the kitchen.
- Calibrated the doors on the Convection Oven.
- Repaired potholes in the driveway and parking lot (thanks to Dan Hupp!)

We also were able to make changes that will allow us to be more efficient and also utilize some spaces better. When the Fire Suppression System was updated, it allowed Chef Trevor to reorganize his line to be more user friendly and efficient.

During installation of the hand sink in the Bar area, we removed the secondary soda dispenser which allowed us to turn the extra SS bar sink into usable shelf space so desperately needed. This was only possible due to the generous donation of Rich Jones who fabricated the new aluminum counter now in place over the original sink. As we all look forward to launching our boats in just two *short* months (darn, that sounds good!), here is a glimpse at three of the pre-season preparations currently underway for the AYC Fleet:

Preseason Safety Course

<u>America's Boating Course</u> will be presented by the Stark County Power Squadron at AYC on Saturday afternoons, March 24 and 31 from 12:30 to 4:30 PM. This is an 8-hour class, which addresses both boat handling and safety.

The course is free and includes an impressive, free manual/book. Successful completion of the course will enable

participants to:

- Meet the educational requirements for legal operation of boats in Ohio by adults and youth.
- *Possibly* enable folks to receive reduced insurance premiums
- Generally improve boating safety at Atwood Lake.

The training will be open to the public. It is being publicized here at AYC, to the AYC Junior Sailors, the SBYC, and the local community. Although pre-registration is not required, calling the number shown on the Power Squadron flier will help assure that an adequate number of manuals will be available.

Merging of Fleets

The Fleet Schedule was revised to incorporate additional powerboat members' activities. An invitation to join the 2018 AYC Fleet will be sent in early March to both sailors and power boaters. The Fleet schedule has been coordinated with the Club Manager, Social Committee, Membership Committee and SBYC Board to avoid scheduling situations which would detract from members' participation. At the request of the AYC Membership Committee, the Champagne Breakfast in 2018 will be open to the public in an attempt to attract new AYC members and new Fleet members. Also, mark your calendars and make plans to attend the Fleet's Pre-Season Dinner meeting on April 6.

Atwood Spring One Design Regatta

Preparations are continuing for the first AYC Spring Regatta for One Design sailboats during the weekend of April 28 and 29. Two types of boats are invited to participate - MC Scows and Thistles. These classes are the classes the Strategic Boating Initiative Committee has deemed to be of the greatest benefit in restarting One Design sailing at AYC, beyond the Sunfish class. Celebrating the History of the AYC and Our 70th Anniversary

The Forties and Fifties

Frank F. Cope, a former Carroll County Common Pleas judge, launched the first sailboat, a 21-foot cat rig, on Atwood Lake in 1939. Mrs. Cope and Lee Stafford were crew, and Richard James subsequently purchased the cat. At that time, the lake extended from the dam to what now is approximately the northern edge of Sunset Valley.

A series of meetings were held with those interested in the development of a boating club on Atwood Lake during 1946 and 1947, and a site for the proposed clubhouse was selected. On Jan. 28, 1948, the Club was incorporated under the name of The Atwood Yacht Club, Inc., and on Feb. 16, 1948, the following temporary officers were elected: Frank E. Cope, Commodore; Dr. L.D. Hart, Vice President; and Coe Smith, Secretary/Treasurer. The following Trustees also were elected: Richard James, Gilbert Harsh, Robert Mallarnee, Henry Partridge, Sam Ryan and Otto Oyler.


On April 1, 1948, the lease for the nine-acre tract where the Club now is located was obtained from the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District, and on May 4, 1948, a meeting was held at the Carroll County Court House where the temporary officers were elected as the first permanent officers and the Board of Trustees of The Atwood Yacht Club. #2014-17

Upon incorporation, 100 shares of stock were sold at \$100 each. With the \$10,000, and many further contributions of labor, material and equipment, the Clubhouse was constructed. Without this spirit of donated time and effort, the dream could never have been realized. Additional contributions were made to furnish and decorate the building and The Atwood Yacht Club was officially opened with a dance on Nov. 20, 1948.

During 1950, adding the living quarters, assembly room, locker room and lockers, and the flagpole in front of the Clubhouse expanded the Clubhouse. Other significant improvements were made in future years, including the electric hoist, docks and picnic area with three brick fireplaces and picnic tables. An active social calendar added to the enjoyment and relaxation of all members and their families. The Club joined the Ohio Inter-Club Yachting Association (O.I.C.Y.A.).

During 1950 and in April 1951, plans were made to have an annual regatta at the Club to be held in September. It was officially named the Harvest Moon Regatta. The original Harvest Moon logo was designed and made by Karl Rollius. The Club hosted the O.I.C.Y.A. seventh and tenth anniversary regattas in 1952 and 1955. The Club joined the American Power Boat Association

(A.P.B.A.), even though powerboat members were unable to race at Atwood Lake due to the horsepower limit. This membership did enable members to be eligible for racing at other motorboat regattas sponsored by A.P.B.A.


